Screw Trap on the Puyallup River

The Puyallup Tribe of Indians and Puyallup River Watershed Council Presents:  
**A Field Trip to Learn How a “Screw Trap” is Used to Study Young Salmon in the Puyallup River**

**WHEN:** Thursday, May 22, 2014 -- Tours at 12:00, 1:00, 2:00 & 3:00 p.m.  
(Note: We will not be having a May 22<sup>nd</sup> 5 - 7 p.m. forum at Puyallup City Hall)

**WHERE:** Puyallup River near the City of Sumner

Please join us for a tour on the Puyallup River to learn about the study and management of young salmon. Russ Ladley, Resource Protection Manager, Puyallup Tribe of Indians (PTI), will lead 45 minute tours to show how the PTI are using a “screw trap” to study young salmon. The trap is part of a salmon assessment project started in 2000. Data collected at the trap is used to estimate abundance of young salmon, forecast future fish returns, and provide critical biological and life history patterns of each salmon species.

Life jackets will be provided by the Puyallup Tribe of Indians.

Due to limited boat space, **RSVP is required**. We'll be meeting near the boat launch.
