Planning for Sustainability

We're approaching one year since the passage of Pierce County's Sustainability 2030 Greenhouse Gas Reduction plan. Through 77 actions in five focus areas, the plan aims to **reduce the county's greenhouse gas emissions 45% by 2030**. Beyond reducing emissions, the plan's actions also strengthen our economy, improve air and water quality, and support public health.

How do we achieve this goal? A growing majority of our electricity mix comes from clean hydropower, so choosing electric options for everyday activities is a key to reducing greenhouse gas emissions. From transportation to home appliances and beyond, an increasing number of electric options exist for items we use every day.
