



**Resolution No. R2021-29**

**A Resolution of the Pierce County Council and Executive Honoring the Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts.**

**Whereas**, since the inception of the Boy Scouts of America in 1910, only four percent of Scouts have earned the highest rank of Eagle Scout; and

**Whereas**, it has been nearly two years since young women were invited to join Scouts BSA, troop level program in Boy Scouts of America and this year on February 8, the Pacific Harbors Council celebrated its inaugural class of Female Eagle Scouts; and

**Whereas**, we recognize Allie Smith, Troop 525, who tackled overgrown vegetation, restoring a trail at Midtown Park in Bonney Lake, empowering residents to take an adventure in nature; and

**Whereas**, we recognize Colleen Fanning, Troop 1932, who constructed a bench for the Tunnel of Trees in Steilacoom, providing a place to take a break after hiking through the area; and

**Whereas**, we recognize Mackenzie Ward, Troop 692, who installed dog agility-course obstacles at the Meridian Habitat Park in South Hill, keeping residents and their canines mentally and physically engaged; and

**Whereas**, we recognize Amy Miseli, Troop 216G, who renovated a playroom at the Tillicum Youth and Family Center in Lakewood, providing a healthy environment for children to learn and grow; and

**Whereas**, we recognize Kaitlin Riggan, Troop 216G, who designed and constructed a custom greenhouse for the Franklin Park Community Garden in Tacoma, ensuring produce year-round; and

**Whereas**, the historic inaugural class of Female Eagle Scouts was celebrated by the Boy Scouts of America organization on February 21, 2021, with a virtual event "Be The Change", which can be viewed on [scouting.org/bethechange](https://scouting.org/bethechange); **Now, Therefore**,
