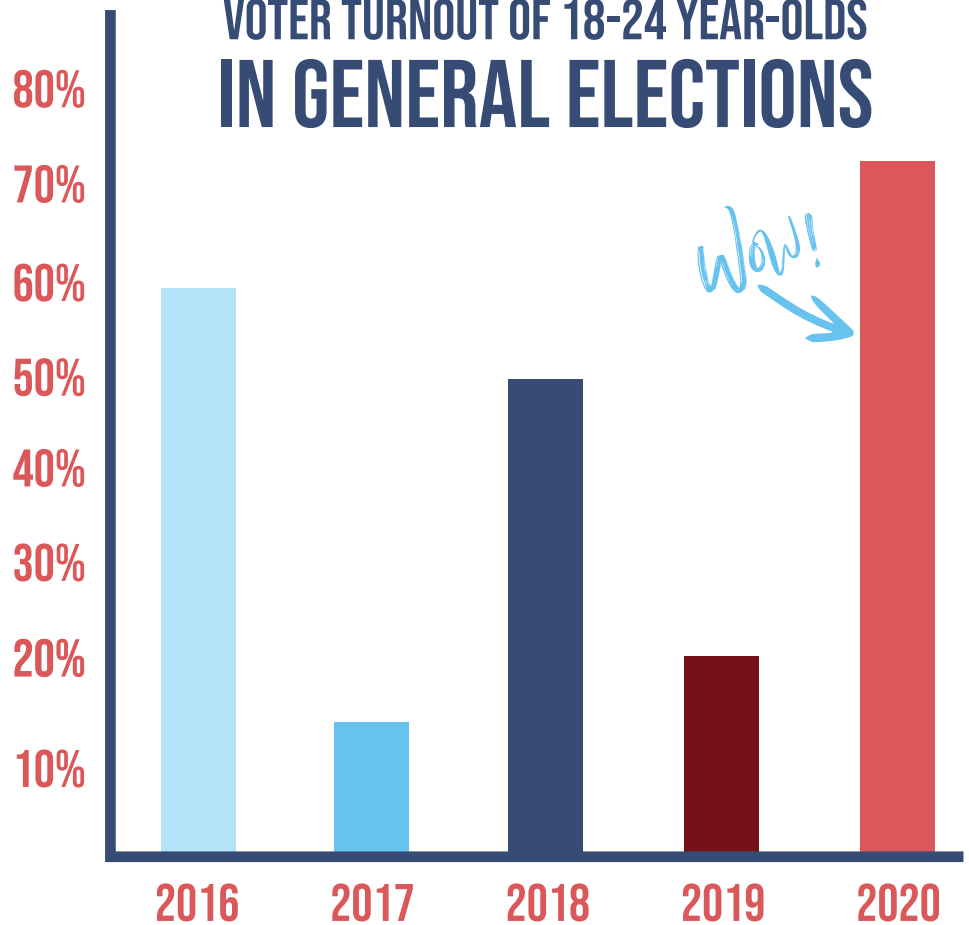


★ FUTURE ★ VOTER

16 and 17 year-olds can pre-register to vote and be automatically registered to vote when they turn 18.

When young voters vote, they **VOTE!** They are too loud to ignore! The turnout of young voters in the 2020 General was **OUTSTANDING!**

VOTER TURNOUT OF 18-24 YEAR-OLDS IN GENERAL ELECTIONS



If you start voting when you're young, it becomes a habit. If young people made a habit of voting regularly, and not just in presidential elections, they would have significant power.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

To become a future voter, you must be...

16

At least 16 years old



A U.S. citizen



A Washington resident

HOW DO I SIGN UP?



You can apply online at VoteWa.gov using your driver's license or state ID.



If you don't have a license, use the last four digits of your social security number and mail a registration form to your county elections office. You can also sign up in-person at your county elections office.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I REGISTER?



A ballot is automatically mailed to you 18 days prior to the next election in which you are eligible to vote in. Make sure your address is up to date. If you return your ballot by mail, make sure it is post marked by election day. No stamp required! If you use a drop box, it must be returned no later than 8 p.m. on election day.
