How to vote



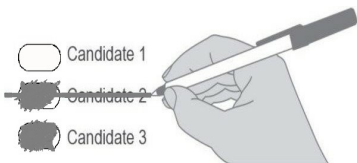
Use an ink pen to fill in the oval to the left of your choice.

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

Renewal of Six-Year Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Levy

DuPont City Council adopted Ordinance 22-1120 regarding the continuation of a regular property tax levy for emergency medical services (EMS). If approved, this proposition would renew the City's regular property tax levy of \$0.50 per thousand dollars of assessed value for an additional six years (for collections beginning in 2024), to provide current levels of emergency medical services.

City of University Place

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

Levy Lid Lift for Dedicated Law Enforcement Funding

The University Place City Council adopted Resolution 1005, authorizing a proposition funding eight additional patrol and traffic officers, and a specialist addressing homelessness, park safety and crime prevention. The proposition increases the City's current property tax levy from \$0.660672963 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation to \$1.01 per \$1,000 in 2024. This levy would be used to compute limitations for subsequent levies. Taxpayers qualifying for an exemption under RCW 84.36.381 would be exempt from the increase. Steilacoom Historical School District No. 1

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

General Obligation Bonds - \$116,000,000

The Board of Directors of Steilacoom Historical School District No. 1 adopted Resolution No. 903-02-21-23 concerning a proposition for bonds to finance capital improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to refinance land and construct a new elementary school, a high school stadium, performing arts center, career technical education space and additional classrooms; make safety, security and accessibility improvements districtwide; and make capital improvements to the District's elementary schools, by issuing \$116,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution No. 903-02-21-23. Should Proposition No. 1 be approved?

Orting School District No. 344

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

General Obligation Bonds - \$150,000,000

The Board of Directors of Orting School District No. 344 adopted Resolution #3.2022-2023 concerning a proposition for bonds to finance capital improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to refinance land and construct a new Orting Elementary School; renovate and expand Ptarmigan Ridge Elementary School; construct labs, classrooms, gym and athletic spaces, including a wrestling room, at Orting High School; replace Cardinal Stadium turf; and if feasible, improve Orting Middle School, by issuing \$150,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution #3.2022-2023.
