Pierce County-City of Bonney Lake (253-862-8602)	Whether or not certain territory in unincorporated Pierce County located adjacent to the current city limits of Bonney Lake should be annexed to the City (Annexation Area 5)	Simple majority
Town of South Prairie (360-897-8878)	Ordinance No. 428 concerns a proposition to finance maintenance & operation expenses; to increase its regular tax levy by 75 cents from \$1.6992 to \$2.4492/1,000 assessed valuation & notwithstanding the otherwise applicable limitations contained in RCW 84.55 (106% lid lift)	Simple majority
City of Tacoma For/Against Contacts: Take Back Tacoma Tacoma United for Fairness	Initiative No. 1 amends Tacoma's anti-discrimination law. Initiative No. 1 removes those provisions of the Tacoma Municipal Code which prohibit discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation, and lending based on sexual orientation or gender identity. A yes vote enacts the Initiative. A no vote defeats the Initiative.	Simple majority
University Place Fire District No. 3 (253-564-1622)	Excess Levy/Maintenance & Operation Levy-\$.70/1000 assessed valuation to provide \$1,322,041, levy in 2002, collect in 2003	2,021 YES votes + a 60% favorable margin
Key Peninsula Fire District No. 16 (253-884-2222)	Excess Levy/Maintenance & Operation Levy-\$.80/1000 assessed valuation to provide \$800,000, levy in 2002, collect in 2003	996 YES votes + a 60% favorable margin
South Prairie Fire Protection District No. 20 (360-897-8874)	To increase its regular tax levy of \$1.00/1000 assessed valuation to \$1.30/1000 assessed valuation as allowed by RCW 52.16.160, notwithstanding the 1% limitation on annual increases in property tax revenues of RCW 84.55. (106% lid lift)	Simple majority
East Pierce County Fire District No. 22 (253-863-1800)	Regular levy for emergency medical services levy-\$.50/1000 of assessed valuation for each of 10 consecutive years, beginning in 2002	1,749 YES votes + a 60% favorable margin
