Block Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Provide the overall coordination of the neighborhood plan, both before and immediately following the disaster. ▪ Assign PC-NET team members to a disaster response team—always work in pairs of two or more (pages 35-36). 			
Safety & Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Shut off the natural gas, electricity and water as necessary. ▪ Identify and rope off all hazardous areas including power lines, broken glass, falling bricks, etc. (pages 41-42). 			
Search & Rescue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Conduct door-to-door search of all the homes in the neighborhood. ▪ Safely rescue any trapped neighbors. ▪ Coordinate the use of OK/HELP cards (pages 39-40). 			
First Aid First Aid Station:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Establish and set-up a neighborhood first aid station. ▪ Treat those who have minor injuries and identify those who require skilled medical care. ▪ Provide a first aid treatment area report to the block coordinator (pages 37-38). 			
Sheltering & Special Needs Sheltering Center:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Establish and set-up a care center for children, adults, and for those with special needs or disabilities. ▪ Ensure that all neighbors have a shelter following a disaster (pages 43-44). 			
Communications*	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Report status of neighborhood to the Pierce County Emergency Operations Center by calling 253-798-7470—use the Communications Team Report form as a guide. ▪ Monitor local media for updated emergency information (Pages 45-46). 			
Damage Assessment*	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Conduct preliminary, then detailed survey of the damage the neighborhood has sustained. ▪ Remind neighbors of the importance of taking photos or videos now and after a disaster strikes for insurance claim documentation (pages 47-48). 			
Animal Care* Animal Care Center:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Collects and provides the block coordinator with information on pets in the neighborhood. ▪ Provides care and feeds the animals following a disaster.
