Reconciliation

Pierce County uses a batch processing and log system which tracks:

- Number of ballots received and ready to count.
- Number of ballots duplicated.
- Number of ballots counted on the voting equipment.

The number of ballots received and ready to count matched the number of ballots counted.

A comparison of ballots counted to voter credit, in the voter registration system, indicates five voters did not receive credit for voting.

The variance of five did not impact the outcome of any election. Variances were checked for individual districts with close races.

This reflects an accuracy rate of .9999. Our ultimate goal is to have a zero variance in the outcome of any given election. The accuracy rate in previous elections has ranged from .9995 to 1.0.

Based upon this variance a comprehensive review of all ballot processing activities was conducted. Election staff performed the following actions during the election certification process:

- Audits were conducted in the duplication department and challenge department to ensure all ballots were properly resolved and sent to tabulation.
- At voting centers, the number of ballots cast was compared to the number of voters signing declarations.
- Queries were conducted against the voter registration database and sorter database to make sure credit was applied properly.

The reconciliation review of this election indicates that voter credit in the voter registration system is five less than the number of ballots cast. The number is also five less than the number of ballots sent to count as indicated on the batch logs. We believe the following factor was responsible for this variance.

- Voter credit was not properly applied. While processing challenged ballots credit was improperly removed.
- When a voter signs and returns another person's ballot it requires credit to be adjusted manually.

Election staff will review processes and procedures related to challenge ballots, "wrong signers" and the assignment of voter credit.
