# Recount

## City of Auburn Council Position No. 6

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Pierce County Canvassing Board Certification Report | December 4, 2013

As required by RCW 29A.64.021 a mandatory manual recount was conducted for the City of Auburn Council Position No. 6. The recount began on December 3 and concluded on December 4, 2013.

Below is a summary of the steps taken during the recount:

### Sorting

- Election staff sorted through all of the ballots counted in the General Election to identify and isolate Auburn Council District No. 6 ballots.
- City of Auburn ballots were sorted to the precinct level.
- The total number of ballots in each precinct were counted.
- Staff reviewed 182,051 ballots. Some ballots were reviewed two or three times during sorting.

### Counting

- Ballots were recounted by hand by a team of four election workers. Ballots were manually counted twice to confirm the votes for each candidate.

### Recount Results

- Confirmed Rich Wagner received the most votes in Pierce County.
- The recount shows an increase of four votes for Wagner and a decrease of one vote for Binetti.
- One ballot was not located during the sorting process and not included in the recount.
- These differences can be attributed to human or machine error. These types of variations are typical for a manual hand recount.
