<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Peninsula School District No. 401 Proposition No. 1</b></p>	<p><b>General Obligation Bonds - \$60,000,000</b> Authorizes the District to issue \$60,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 20 years and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds. If approved, it would fund new construction, repairs and renovations, student safety and other upgrades to designated schools and facilities throughout the District.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">10,390 <b>TOTAL</b> votes plus a 60% favorable margin</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Peninsula School District No. 401 Proposition No. 2</b></p>	<p><b>Capital Projects and Technology Levy</b> Authorizes the District to fund construction, replacement, upgrading and modernization of educational facilities, including technology improvements and excess levies on all taxable property within the District; provided, if Proposition No. 1 is also approved, the levies would be used for technology improvements only and will be reduced.</p> <p>\$10,670,000 for collection in 2015, \$10,900,000 in 2016, \$11,100,00 in 2017, \$11,440,000 in 2018 and \$11,790,000 in 2019.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Simple Majority</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>East Pierce Fire &amp; Rescue Proposition No. 1</b></p>	<p><b>Property Tax Levy for Maintenance and Operation Expenses</b> Authorizes the District to levy, without regard to the dollar rate and percentage limitations, a property tax upon all taxable property within the District. To be used for maintenance and operations and to maintain the current level of fire and emergency medical services.</p> <p>\$4,700,000 for collection in 2015, \$4,800,000 in 2016 and 2017 and \$4,900,000 in 2018.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">5,032 <b>YES</b> votes plus a 60% favorable margin</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 21 (Graham Fire &amp; Rescue) Proposition No. 1</b></p>	<p><b>Property Tax Levy for Maintenance and Operation Expenses</b> Authorizes the District to levy, without regard to the dollar rate and percentage limitations, a property tax upon all taxable property within the District. To be used for maintenance and operations and to maintain the current level of fire and emergency medical services.  \$2,750,000 for collection in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">2,592 <b>YES</b> votes plus a 60% favorable margin</p>
