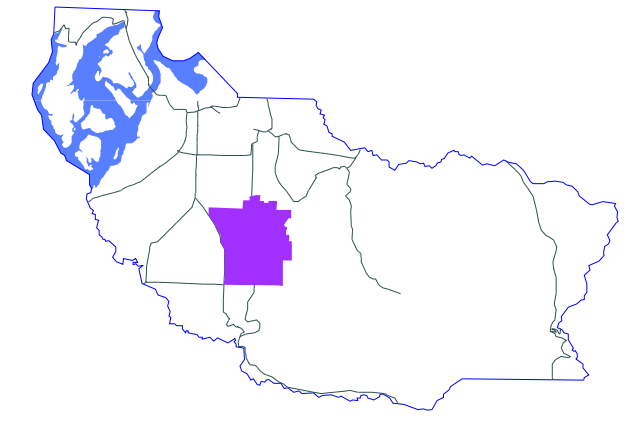


Pierce County, Washington

11 Mid Nisqually River Sub-basin
12 Muck Creek Sub-basin
14 Ohop Creek Sub-basin

Note: There are four regional watersheds in Pierce County that drain into Puget Sound. They are called Water Resource Inventory Areas (WRIAs). Tacoma, Puyallup & Nisqually Watersheds are three of the WRIAs. The four WRIAs were divided into twenty-four sub-basins by the Pierce County Watershed Ranking Committee, which was established by the County Executive in 1987 with the goal of ranking County watersheds. The "Final Report of the Pierce County Watershed Committee" was adopted through Resolution No. R 88-452, by the County Council, November 29, 1988. In recent years, two additional sub-basins, Burely/Minter Creek and Fox Island, have been added to the list, bringing the total number of sub-basins to 26.
