

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INVENTORY STATEMENT (HMIS) SUBMITTAL STANDARD

Per *International Fire Code* section 407.5, the Pierce County Fire Prevention Bureau *Hazardous Materials Inventory Statement (HMIS) Submittal Standard* shall be applicable where hazardous materials subject to permits under 2009 *International Fire Code* section 2701.5 are located on the premise, or when required by the Fire Marshal.

This HMIS shall comply with the requirements of *International Fire Code* section 2701.5.2 and shall include the following information:

- a. Product name
- b. Component
- c. Chemical Abstract Service (CAS) number
- d. Location(s) of use and or storage
- e. Container size
- f. Hazard Classification
- g. Amount in storage
- h. Amount in use for “closed systems.”
- i. Amount in use for “open systems.”

NOTE: All Hazardous Materials stored or used shall be classified according to 2009 *International Fire Code* Appendix ‘E.’ The classification shall include the physical and health hazards of a material or mixture.

NOTE: Material Safety Data Sheets shall be submitted with the HMIS.

HMIS Preparation

Preparing a Hazardous Materials Inventory Statement requires knowledge of the *International Fire Code*, the *International Building Code*, and a background in hazardous materials. Care should be taken to be certain the preparer of the HMIS is qualified to prepare an HMIS per *International Fire Code* requirements.

Hazardous Materials Management Plan (HMMP)

After review of the submitted HMIS, the Fire Marshal may require a Hazardous Materials Management Plan (HMMP) as specified in 2009 *International Fire Code* section 2701.5.1.
