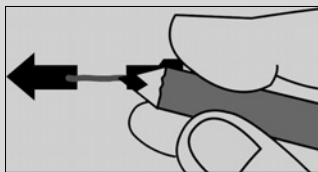


## Instructions

**Property Tax Levy for Maintenance and Operation Expenses**

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 3 (West Pierce Fire & Rescue) adopted Resolution No. 040715-004 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation expenses. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to levy, without regard to the dollar rate and percentage limitations imposed by Ch. 84.52 RCW, a property tax upon all taxable property within the District as follows:

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 16 adopted Resolution No. 04-15-616 concerning an increase in the District's regular property tax levy. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will restore the District's regular property tax levy for maintenance and operations to one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) of assessed value for collection in 2016, set the limit factor at one hundred six percent (106%) for each of the five (5) succeeding years and use the 2021 levy dollar amount for computing the limitation for subsequent levies.
