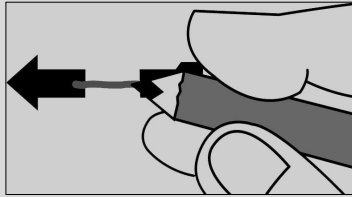


**Sample Ballot - Special Election

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

Replacement of Expiring Educational Programs, Maintenance and Operations Levy

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 02-15-16, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs, maintenance and operations expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs, maintenance and operations expenses, all as provided in Resolution No. 02-15-16:

Bonds to Construct and Renovate School Facilities, and Make Safety Improvements

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 03-15-16, concerning a proposition to finance construction, renovation and safety of schools. This proposition would authorize the District to: construct a new Southworth Elementary School, construct a new Yelm Middle School, renovate Prairie Elementary School, construct a new 9th Grade Campus at Yelm High School, make District-wide safety and security improvements, and relocate Technology Center; issue no more than \$59,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 03-15-16. The Board of Directors of Carbonado Historical School District No. 19 adopted Resolution No. 07-15 concerning a proposition to finance capital improvements to District facilities. If approved, this proposition will authorize the District to modernize, upgrade and replace portions of the Historical School building; to provide safety and security upgrades; to provide for ADA compliance; to issue \$1,750,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 20 years; and to levy additional property taxes annually to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 07-15. General Obligation Bonds - \$145,600,000

The Board of Directors of Sumner School District No. 320 adopted Resolution No. 9/15-16 concerning a proposition to provide classrooms, and improve infrastructure and safety. If approved, this proposition will authorize the District to: build a new elementary school and early learning center, replace Emerald Hills Elementary School, expand and modernize Sumner High School, expand Bonney Lake High School and Mountain View Middle School, and make middle school field and District-wide safety and security improvements; issue no more than \$145,600,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 9/15-16. General Obligation Bonds - \$236,700,000

The Board of Directors of Bethel School District No. 403 adopted Resolution No. 11 (15-16) concerning a proposition to finance capital improvements to education facilities. If approved, this proposition will authorize the District to replace or renovate six elementary, middle and high schools; construct one elementary school; repair roofs; upgrade security, alarm and fire sprinklers and technology infrastructure; make earthquake and safety improvements; install energy-efficient heating and lighting; and construct or improve playfields and athletic facilities by issuing \$236,700,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years and levying annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds. The Board of Directors of White River School District No. 416 adopted Resolution No. 15-18 concerning a proposition to finance capital improvements to District facilities. If approved, this proposition will authorize the District to renovate, upgrade and/or expand building capacity at Glacier Middle School and Elk Ridge, Wilkeson, Mountain Meadow and Foothills Elementary schools; upgrade safety, security, technology equipment and community activity fields throughout the District and construct an athletic stadium at White River High School; to issue \$98,825,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 20 years; and to levy additional property taxes annually to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 15-18.
