The project will increase the system's efficiency by capturing a larger amount of the spring water. It will also reduce maintenance and infiltration of impurities from surface water.	\$300,000	\$300,000
Catholic Community Services	Family Housing Network Building Exterior Rehab Rehabilitation of the exterior masonry of the Family Housing Network headquarter building to improve its structural integrity.	\$37,841	\$37,841

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Our Sister's House	Women Empowered: Stepping Stones A two-phase educational and supportive program that begins with helping survivors of intimate partner abuse to learn self-sufficiency, self-worth, and self-confidence. The next phase focuses on teaching children to cope with the aftereffects of witnessing violence and teaching mothers effective parenting skills.	\$39,119	\$0
Pierce County Housing Authority	Ready to Rent Assists residents to prepare for, obtain, and maintain stable, permanent housing despite barriers such as bad credit, evictions, debt to prior landlords, or criminal history.	\$28,000	\$0
South Sound Outreach	Sound Outreach Solutions Assists low-income families to access services and benefits such as SNAP, health insurance, Medicare guidance, utility assistance, tax preparation, predatory loans alternatives, financial capabilities, and financial inclusion.	\$54,790	\$0
