Ballot Title

Shall the Town of South Prairie be authorized to impose a PERMANENT regular property tax levy of fifty (50¢) or less per thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) of assessed valuation to provide basic and advanced emergency medical care and services?

Explanatory Statement

Voters in the Town of South Prairie have supported Emergency Medical Services (EMS) by authorizing previous 6-year property tax levies used exclusively to fund EMS. The current EMS levy expired on December 31, 2017. Rather than renew the 6-year EMS levy, the proposed measure will renew the levy as a permanent levy.

Renewal of the EMS levy will provide funding needed for the Town to fund an emergency medical care and services program. Revenue from the levy is used for services, personnel, training of personnel, equipment, supplies, vehicles and facilities.

If approved by voters, this levy will allow the Town of South Prairie to continue to fund the cost of providing emergency medical care and services within the Town.

- Not under the authority of the Department of Corrections.
