

### How to vote




Use an ink pen to fill in the oval to the left of your choice. **Do not use felt tip markers.**

## Yelm Community Schools

### Special Election - Proposition No. 1

#### Bonds to Improve Safety and Replace Schools

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 02-18-19, concerning a proposition to finance safety improvements and replace schools. This proposition would authorize the District to: make safety and security improvements at all schools, which will include control entry/access, security cameras, lighting and fencing; replace Yelm Middle School and Southworth Elementary School and remove portable classrooms from these schools; issue no more than \$98,985,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 02-18-19. Should this proposition be:

## Peninsula School District No. 401

### Special Election - Proposition No. 1

#### General Obligation Bonds - \$198,550,000

The Board of Directors of Peninsula School District No. 401 adopted Resolution No. 18-14 concerning a proposition for general obligation bonds. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to rebuild and expand Artondale and Evergreen Elementary Schools; acquire a new school site, if necessary; construct and equip two new elementary schools; undertake necessary major modernization projects at District schools; issue up to \$198,550,000 of general obligation bonds to be issued in series, each maturing with a maximum of 20 years; and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 18-14. Should Proposition No. 1 be:

## Bethel School District No. 403

### Special Election - Proposition No. 1

#### General Obligation Bonds - \$443,000,000

The Board of Directors of Bethel School District No. 403 adopted Resolution No. 04(18-19) concerning a proposition to finance construction and renovation of schools. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to: construct a new high school to replace Bethel High; construct two new elementary schools; renovate and expand Cedarcrest Middle, Challenger High, Graham Kapowsin High, Evergreen Elementary, Naches Trail Elementary and Elk Plain K-8; make District-wide health, safety, security and other improvements; issue no more than \$443,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 04(18-19). Should Proposition No. 1 be:
