<b>Lindquist Dental Clinic for Children</b>	<b>Uncompensated Dental Care for Children</b> Provides accessible, compassionate, and effective dental care to children in need, ages 0 through 20. No child is turned away due to inability to pay.	<b>\$30,000.00</b>	<b>\$27,000.00</b>
<b>Emergency Food Network (EFN)</b>	<b>Warehouse Distribution Center</b> EFN collects, stores, and distributes food to 71 partner food pantries, hot meal sites, and shelters in Pierce County. <b>YWCA Pierce County</b>	<b>Legal Services Program</b> Provides family services to low-income and homeless survivors of domestic violence and their children by providing legal advocacy and representation for legal issues that are a direct result of their victimization. While in our care, children will receive high-quality academic, health, and social emotional enriching activities that promote academic achievement and improved health and well-being while supporting parents/families who are working to support their families, while continuing education, or who need assistance in caring for their children.	<b>\$17,000.00</b>	<b>\$15,000.00</b>
<b>Buckley Senior Citizens</b>	<b>Senior Center Meal Site and Transportation Program</b> Provides transportation service, recreational opportunities, and low-cost hot noon meals to senior citizens in the White River School District area.	<b>\$50,000.00</b>	<b>\$46,150.00</b>
<b>Pierce County AIDS Foundation</b>	<b>Housing Options</b> Provides safe, affordable, decent, and accessible housing to low-income people who are living with HIV or AIDS, and to minimize the exacerbating effects homelessness can have upon a person with a damaged immune system. This is accomplished through collaboration with private and public entities and seeking resources to provide short-term and long-term housing relief to people living with HIV who are either homeless or at risk of homelessness.	<b>\$18,691.00</b>	<b>\$12,431.00</b>
<b>The Rescue Mission</b>	<b>Good Neighbor Café</b> Serves meals to people experiencing homelessness and poverty in our community. This includes homeless neighbors residing at the Rescue Mission or other partner shelters as well as anyone from the community who needs a nutritious meal and cannot afford one. The Good Neighbor Café is open 365 days a year and last year provided 311,000 nutritious meals to the most impoverished in Pierce County.	<b>\$50,000.00</b>	<b>\$38,000.00</b>
