- City of Orting – Advisory Proposition No. 1 Fireworks Ban - Simple Majority needed to pass
- Puyallup School District No. 3 – General Obligation Bonds \$273,000,000 – 20,932 total votes plus a 60% Favorable Majority
- White River School District No. 416 – Supplemental Levy – Excess Taxes – Simple Majority needed to pass
- Fire Protection District No. 13 (Browns Point / Dash Point) Multi-Year Levy Lid Lift (EMS) - Simple Majority needed to pass
- Fire Protection District No. 21 (Graham Fire & Rescue) Multi-Year Levy Lid Lift (EMS) - Simple Majority needed to pass
- Fire Protection District No. 23 (Ashford, Elbe, Alder) Single-Year Levy Lid Lift (EMS) - Simple Majority needed to pass
