Nourish Pierce County	Basic Food Assistance Provides nutritious food and support services for individuals and families in need with compassion, dignity, and respect. No one in need is turned away.	\$35,000.00	\$33,692.00
Pierce County AIDS Foundation	Housing Options Provides safe, affordable, decent, and accessible housing to low-income people who are living with HIV or AIDS, and to minimize the exacerbating effects homelessness can have upon a person with a damaged immune system. St. Leo's Food Connection	St. Leo's Food Bank Offers emergency food assistance to more than 1,500 people who live in the Pierce County Consortium, about 8.6% of the agency's total clientele. 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	Provides low-income men who are experiencing homelessness in our community the basic needs of shelter, food and hygiene while providing them access to services such as coordinated entry and diversion, case management, an on-site addiction recovery program, mental health counseling, adult education, career counseling, service learning opportunities, job creation and leadership training.		
The Rescue Mission	Good Neighbor Café Serves meals to people experiencing homelessness and poverty in our community. This includes homeless neighbors residing at the Rescue Mission or other partner shelters as well as anyone from the community who needs a nutritious meal and cannot afford one. The Good Neighbor Café is open 365 days a year and last year provided 311,000 nutritious meals to the most impoverished in Pierce County.	\$50,000.00	\$50,000.00
Vadis	Full Lives and Secure Homes/FLASH Provides employment series, including career path development, job placement, job retention, follow-up services, outreach support and services, Ready to Rent and life skills trainings to individuals experiencing, or at risk of experiencing homelessness. YMCA	Childcare Provides children from low-income Pierce County households the opportunity to attend our safe, high-quality, affordable, and convenient before and after school child care program. While in our care, children will receive high-quality academic, health, and social emotional enriching activities that promote academic achievement and improved health and well-being while supporting parents/families who are working to support their families, while continuing education, or who need assistance in caring for their children.	\$17,500.00	\$15,692.00
