How to vote




Use an ink pen to fill in the oval to the left of your choice. **Do not use felt tip markers.**

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

Replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 01-19-20, authorizing a replacement levy to continue support for educational programs. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on taxable property within the District, for educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State (including special education, nurses, counselors, safety staff, graduation readiness, technology, athletics, and extracurricular activities):

Tacoma School District No. 10

Special Election - Proposition No. 1

Neighborhood School Improvements and Safety Upgrades - \$535,000,000

The Board of Directors of Tacoma School District No. 10 adopted Resolution No. 2065 concerning a proposition to finance capital improvements to neighborhood schools districtwide. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to replace or renovate eight deteriorating neighborhood schools across Tacoma; implement health, safety, security, and seismic upgrades; repair roofs, alarm/sprinkler systems, and HVAC/plumbing systems for clean water and safe air; improve playground/athletic facilities; and make other capital improvements; issue \$535,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum 25 years to finance these capital improvements; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2065. The Board of Directors of Sumner-Bonney Lake School District No. 320 adopted Resolution No. 9/19-20, concerning a proposition to finance construction and improvement of school facilities. If approved, Proposition No. 2 will authorize the District to: build out a new high school to replace Sumner High School (including a new Performing Arts Center, a new gym and a new pool); acquire land; construct a turf/lighted field on land to be acquired in the Tehaleh area; issue no more than \$205,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 9/19-20. Levy Lid Lift to Restore the Regular Property Tax Levy

The Board of Governance of Valley Regional Fire Authority has adopted Resolution No. 156 concerning restoring the regular property tax levy to its original rate. If approved, this proposition would authorize restoration of the regular property levy rate of \$1.00/\$1,000 assessed value for collection in 2021, as described in the Resolution. The increased levy would be used to sustain fire protection and emergency medical services within the Authority.
