



## Environmental Grant Announcement – 2021 cycle

Grant application deadline: **April 7, 2021**

### Grant Overview:

Grants are available for nonprofit organizations, schools, other groups, and individuals to work collaboratively in or with the Chambers-Clover Creek Watershed Council (CCWC) on drainage, water quality, and habitat issues within the WRIA12 watershed. Projects may include watershed education and outreach activities, enhancement and restoration activities, volunteer or student projects, and purchase of signage, equipment, or supplies.

The maximum grant amount is \$2,500 per project. You are encouraged to apply for less if your project does not require the full amount. A total of \$20,000 in grants may be awarded this year.

### Grant Criteria & Requirements:

Projects must be located within the Chambers-Clover Creek Watershed (WRIA12). PreK-16 schools, nonprofit organizations, students and individuals may apply. If an individual receives a grant they may be responsible for reporting income on their federal income taxes, unless they have a fiscal agent. Thanks to fiscal agent sponsorship provided by the Clover Creek Council, the grant funds will be made available upon award. Expense receipts are required.

Should a grant be awarded, you will be asked to make a project presentation at a watershed council meeting in 2022, and complete a brief written final report, including your accomplishments, successes, and challenges.

Grant applications are due April 7, 2021 - postmarked, hand-delivered or by *email preferred*.

This grant is funded by Pierce County Planning and Public Works - Surface Water Management Division and the City of Lakewood - Public Works Engineering Department. High quality projects in the city of Lakewood and the County's jurisdictions will be given priority consideration.
