



## **Pierce County Council District 2**

Hans Zeiger represents District 2, which includes Puyallup, Sumner, Fife, Edgewood, Milton, Pacific, Southeast Auburn, Northeast Tacoma, Dash Point, Browns Point, and the Port of Tacoma.

He is vice chair of the Council's standing Economic and Infrastructure Development Committee.

Zeiger previously served in the Washington State Legislature for a decade. In the state House of Representatives, Zeiger worked to secure funding to complete state Route 167 and took a lead role in higher education policy. He gained a reputation as a bipartisan collaborator, being named by the National Institute for Civil Discourse as co-recipient of the Gabrielle Giffords Award for Civility in State Governance in 2015.

In the Senate, he chaired the Senate Early Learning and K-12 Education Committee, co-chaired a task force on poverty reduction, and worked to tackle the homelessness crisis as ranking member on the Housing Stability and Affordability Committee.

Zeiger was a Leadership Fellow of the Henry M. Jackson Foundation and a Rodel Fellow of the Aspen Institute. He served on the boards of the Washington State Historical Society, the William D. Ruckelshaus Center, and the South Hill Historical Society. He is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Puyallup and the author of *Puyallup in World War II*. Zeiger is also an officer in the Washington Air National Guard, and has a consulting business helping businesses and entrepreneurs to write their histories.

A graduate of Puyallup High School, Zeiger holds a bachelor's degree from Hillsdale College and a master's degree in public policy from Pepperdine University.

Zeiger lives in Puyallup with his wife Erin, two daughters and two stepsons. They enjoy spending time with their cockapoo dogs and hiking throughout the Pacific Northwest.
